Have you received Child Care Counts funding since early 2020?

 - Bonuses/pay increases
 - Program improvements
 - Other updates
- What will happen to compensation and tuition if funding ends
- How to send a letter to their elected officials

For the parents you serve, have one-on-one conversations and/or send emails (template sent):

- What Child Care Counts is, what you used it for, that it ends in January 2024
- Potential impact on tuition also include this information in the email you send
- Put up poster in your entryway/bulletin boards to encourage parent <u>letter writing</u>
